Using systems thinking to explore research capacity building in AHPs

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Aim


The Allied Health Professions' (AHP) Research and Innovation Strategy for England gives us bold, clearly stated strategic aims and objectives for the acceleration of AHP-led research and innovation. As part of a year-long, HEE SE funded, Clinical Education Improvement Fellowship, this project aims to use a systems lens to identify how these strategic aims can be implemented. Over the course of the year, the project will:

- Explore current methods of research capacity building.
- Find out what 'good' looks like to individuals and organisations.
- Investigate the mutual benefits of partnerships between higher education and integrated care systems.
- Identify what factors increase the likelihood of success and under which circumstances.

Methodology

The project utilises systems thinking to establish what works, for whom and under which circumstances. To do this I will need to identify stakeholders, gain differing perspectives and map the system as a whole. In seeking a rich picture, I will collate information from a mixture of


literature, published guidelines, case studies, in-formal interviews and social media.

partnerships in those who had scored a higher percentage of 3 and 4* results.

- Formal partnerships with NHS trusts and social care with shared strategy and research priorities.
- Dynamic approach to development of clinical academics with cofunding and established support structure.
- Supportive structure and co-funding for doctoral and postdoctoral students.
- Honorary and joint-funded appointments for NHS staff.
- Combined NHS and University research centres.

These themes emerge as part of a whole view of the environment, involving those factors not related to clinical partnerships and should not be viewed in isolation.
